What is Cystitis (non-infectious)

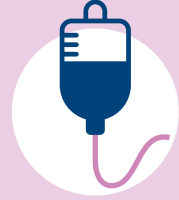
Cystitis is the inflammation of the bladder, not caused by an infection of the urinary tract. Some examples include: ²

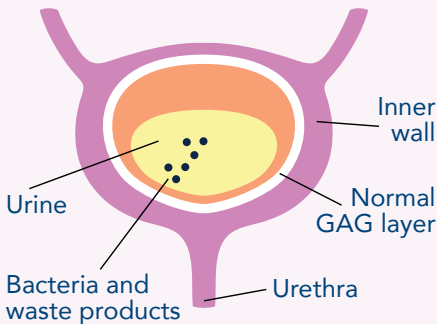

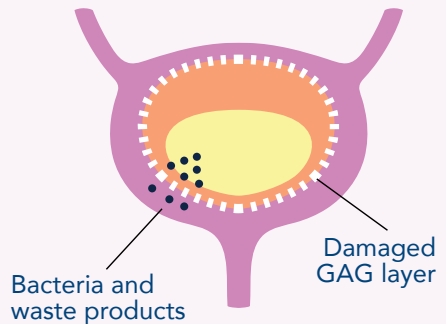

Common types of Cystitis

Interstitial cystitis/ Bladder Pain Syndrome (IC/BPS)

- A chronic condition that is found through a diagnosis of exclusion (all other potential conditions are ruled out)
- The causes of this condition are not exactly known but thought to be potentially due to a defective bladder lining or an autoimmune disorder (your own body attacks its own cells)
- As IC/BPS resembles other conditions like chronic UTIs and overactive bladder, it may not be treated correctly, therefore not effective in relieving symptoms³

Radiation-induced cystitis

- Inflammation and scarring of the bladder caused by pelvic radiotherapy which has damaged the bladder tissue.
- Pelvic radiotherapy may be used to treat various cancers in the pelvic region⁴

Chemical-induced cystitis

- Inflammation of the bladder due to various chemical agents.
- Some examples include:
 - chemotherapy agents (cyclophosphamide),
 - anaesthetic agents abusively consumed (ketamine)
 - environmental factors (soaps, gels, dyes or spermicides)⁵

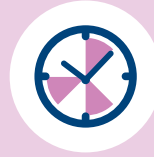

Common Symptoms

Symptoms will vary between each person, you may develop some or all of the following symptoms, with ranges in timelines and severity too. ^{3,4,5}



Pain, burning or stinging when you pee



Needing to pee more often and urgently than usual



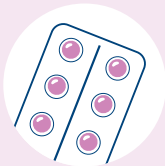
Pain can be in the abdominal, urethral or genital area. It is often associated with sexual intercourse

Management

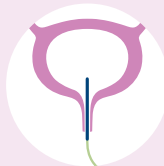
Managing these conditions focuses on **soothing bladder irritation, reducing pain and supporting the bladder lining**. Treatment is aimed at improving symptoms rather than the underlying condition. Management often includes medications to help control pain and urinary symptoms, as well as lifestyle adjustments such as dietary changes or doing gentle exercise. Physiotherapy and pelvic

floor therapy can also be beneficial, as they have been shown to help relieve symptoms like pelvic pain, urgency, and frequency.

Bladder instillations such as **ialuril®** may additionally be recommended to help restore and protect the bladder's natural GAG layer, supporting the bladder lining and reducing symptoms ^{3,4,5,6}

ialuril is a bladder instillation that can be used in various types of cystitis. It helps replenish the affected bladder lining. The number of instillations depends on the individual, healthcare professional and type of cystitis. Generally, treatments follow this course:⁷

1 instillation

a week in the **1st month**



1 instillation

every 2 weeks in **the 2nd month**



1 instillation

a month in the **following months** until stable remission of the symptoms, or as prescribed by your doctor

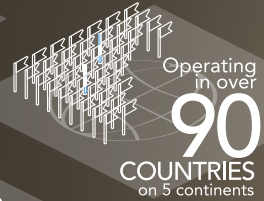
